

John appeared in summer stock, as well as in Rain off-Broadway, Grease on its national tour, and Over Here, a Broadway smash starring the Andrews Sisters. When he was in Los Angeles with Grease, in which he played the dopey, babyish "Doody," he began making the valuable contacts that were to lead to guest-starring roles in such top television shows as Emergency, The Rookies, and Medical Center.

Travolta insists he owes the most to Bob LeMond, his manager, who spotted him in a local stock production of Bye Bye Birdie when John was still in his teens. LeMond obviously saw the star quality that was always there. His direction and guidance helped John greatly during those early years.

"In the beginning, I found the jobs myself, looking in the trade papers," John reminisces about his career. "I auditioned like hundreds
